

Château Leydet-Valentin

SAINT EMILION GRAND CRU

Area: 5.3 Hectares

Production: 3,500 cases

Wine-making: Traditional—manual harvesting.

Location: Commune of St. Emilion, on the border of Pomerol.

Soil: Moraine stones, sand and clay with crasse de fer.

Blend: 60% Merlot, 30% Cab Franc, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon

History: This property belongs to the Leydet family, which also owns Château Valois vineyards in Pomerol. Under the management of Frédéric Leydet, this small estate has kept the immaculate wine-making techniques that get the approval of the **Saint Emilion “Grand Cru”** Appellation. The wine has always had excellent Ratings in Hachette and Fleurus Guides.



Tasting Notes: Dressed with a very deep rubis color, intense and profound, this 2003 vintage develops a very elegant nose with aromas of cherry, licorice, plum and toast. Very well balanced in the mouth with light structure, volume and a good finish of black and red candied berries. Will be even more remarkable in two to three years.
